Happy New Year!

Christmas was last week? Did you get what you wanted? That is a tricky question. In our family we ask the kids to make lists for what they would like to receive on Christmas morning. It is helpful to know what the kids want so that they can get presents that match their interests. However, they often don't get everything on their lists. They must be careful to not let expectations cause problems of disappointment. Also, sometimes, a person in our family receives a present they wanted, but then realizes it is not what they thought it would be. Christmas day can be such a joyful day, but it can bring a let down if we are not careful.



As we enter the new year it is important to remember and celebrate the gift of Christmas that continues long past December 25. A little over two thousand years ago, Earth got a Savior. To be more precise, the nation of Israel received the Messiah, the savior that had been promised for hundreds of years. They received their big Christmas present. And, they received the exact present they wanted. However, it was not the Savior they wanted. The people wanted a Messiah who would physically lead an army that would overthrow and crush the Roman Empire and any other enemy of Israel. They wanted a Messiah who would recreate the kingdom of David, but larger and greater.

Instead, the present they received was a baby, born to poor humble parents with only shepherds and foreigners as the celebrants of the occasion. It would be easy to understand the disappointment of the people by understanding the expectations they had for their savior. Still, losing sight of the real present of Christmas they lose out on the real power of the gift. We have the potential of falling into the same trap today. We celebrated the birth of our Savior last month on Christmas day. However, we must embrace the power of the gift of Jesus into the new year to enjoy that Christmas present.

I remind you of the immortal words of the Rolling Stones when they said, "You can't always get what you want... but you get what you need." We wanted a Savior to save us, and we got that. But we also got a savior who challenges us and pushes us out of our comfort zone. These aspects weren't on our Christmas list. Jesus calls us to be in service to one another, to help the poor, clothe the naked, visit the sick, and to be servants to those in need. He even challenges us to love our enemies.

As we enter 2023, let's remember that our Christmas present was not just to be saved by Jesus, but to be transformed by Jesus and to be the vessels of others being loved by Christ. As we walk into a new year of promises and challenges, never forget that the gift of Jesus is going to make 2023 a brighter year for us, our family and our community. It won't be perfect or easy, but it will be filled with joy and hope. Let's enjoy the Christmas love and New Year promise this month!

In addition, payments may be for rent, utilities, car payments and insurance. No money is ever given to the family but paid directly to the contractor.

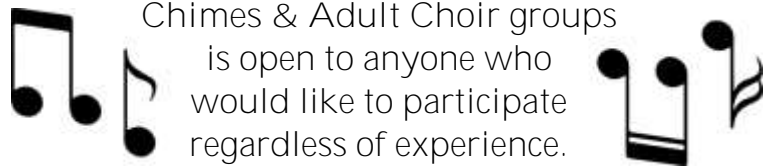
