Greetings,

"Christ died for us while we were yet sinners. That proves God's love for us" (Romans 5:7-8)

Valentine's Day is February 14, and as such, February is often the month connected with the concept of love. Each Valentine's Day we see hearts, chocolates, cards, and flowers everywhere. There is even a newer holiday now on February 13 called Galentine's Day that focuses specifically on friendships and support systems that women have with each other. The concept of love at this time of year is important, but can also come off as cliché or cheesy. However, love is a critical and vital focus of the Christian faith. Our faith is built on the foundation of love.



You have most likely heard that the Greek language (the language the New Testament was written in) had multiple words for the concept of love. Each word said 'love' but meant a different type of love. The Greek language has four expressed types of love: phileo, agape, eros and storge. Phileo means brotherly love, the love that family members have for each other. Philadelphia is translated into the 'city of brotherly love'. Eros is the type of love most connected with Valentine's Day. It is romantic love. Storge is platonic love. It is the love a person has for a friend. Of these four words, the Bible uses three: phileo, agape and eros. Agape love is the foundation that the Christian faith is built on. Agape is unconditional love. This love is the very definition of the way God feels for God's creation. It is the reason that God came to us as a man, to die and rise for us that we may live and not die. It is the type of love that is giving and sacrificial.

We celebrate Valentine's Day as a romantic holiday. The holiday finds its origins in the 5th century when marriage was outlawed for young men, in order to make better soldiers. A priest named Valentine decided to officiate the weddings of young couples in secret. We celebrate the romantic/eros love of these couples in spirit with Valentine's Day. However, I want you to take a moment and look at the root of what Valentine's Day is about. It was not eros love that made Valentine's Day important. It was Agape love. It was the unconditional sacrificial love of a young priest to minister and support young couples in his midst. This agape love led to his eventual arrest and execution. St. Valentine modeled the love of God to others.

Philio, eros, and storge love are all gifts from God and can be celebrated this month. However, it is agape love that holds us up, keeps us going and brings us back to God. During this month, think about how you can celebrate agape love on Valentine's Day in the way that Valentine did. What are ways you can show unconditional love; sacrificial love for another person in your life? How can you show kindness to another? By doing so, you are showing them God's love through your actions! Have a blessed February and remember... God loves you and there is nothing you can do about it!



Confirmation Class Meals Sign Up


