Greetings,

Welcome to March! Winter is not over yet, but we know that it will be spring soon. The weather will warm. The days will increase and the flowers will bloom. Spring is almost here. March also marks a change in the church calendar as well. We are leaving behind the season of Epiphany and entering the season of Lent. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2 this year.

Let me take a minute and highlight the season of Lent for you. Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays. As I shared, this begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. The word Lent, originates from the Anglo-Saxon word lenc-

ten, which means spring. The season is a preparation for celebrating Easter. Historically, Lent started as a period of fasting and spiritual preparation for baptism by converts into the Christian faith. It then grew into a spiritual practice of penance by all Christians. The first Sunday describes Jesus' temptation by Satan; and the sixth Sunday, (Passion/Palm Sunday) Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

The Lenten season is a time when all in the Christian faith turn with Jesus to face the Cross. It's a time of reflection. It's a time of receiving from the Lord and giving to others. It's a time of letting go of parts of our lives we need to shed and finding parts of God that we need to embrace. It's a time when we look into our hearts to examine our walk with Christ and re-evaluate our sense of direction in our lives. We are called to align our focus with the heart of Christ.

When Jesus began his journey toward Jerusalem at the beginning of his ministry, He knew the road would end at Golgatha. Still, he did not turn away or delay his journey. Every Lenten Season we are asked to join Jesus on that road so we can better understand His life and death. The Via Dolorosa, or "The way of sorrows" is the path Jesus would have been forced to walk as he carried his cross through the town. Some say the Via Dolorosa started at his baptism. Others say it started in Bethlehem with the announcement from the Angels. Max Lucado wrote that the Via Dolorosa began in the hall of Heaven. The Journey began when God left Heaven's gates in search of us. Armed with nothing more than a passion to win your heart, God came looking for you with only one thought in mind. God wanted to bring His Children home. I cling to this notion of love and grace. Lent reminds me to reconnect with God. However, it is also a reminder of the love and peace of God that I want to know.

This year we will begin our journey on Ash Wednesday, March 2, with a worship service at 7:00 PM. We will travel each week towards that cross until we arrive on Easter Sunday with a celebration of life over death! Take this journey through Lent with me. Below are a few verses you can read each week as you make your way through your journey with Christ. God Bless!


MISSION OF THE MONTH



The World Day of Prayer is an international ecumenical Christian laywomen's initiative, started in the US in 1887. It is run under the motto "Informed Prayer and Prayerful Action," and is celebrated annually in over 170 countries on the first Friday in March.

Through the World Day of Prayer, women worldwide learn how their sisters of other countries, languages and cultures understand the biblical passages in their context. They learn of the concerns and needs of those women and to empathize and feel in solidarity with them.

They are also encouraged to take up the burdens of other people, to sympathize with the problems of other countries and cultures and pray with and for them. They are further encouraged to become aware of their talents and use them in the service of society. The World Day of Prayer aims to demonstrate that prayer and action are inseparable and that both have immeasurable influence in the world. Every year, worship service focuses on a different country and a specific theme. World Day of Prayer National/Regional Committees of that country prepare the order of worship on these themes to be used on the next World Day of Prayer. The theme for 2022 is, "I Know the Plans I Have For You" (Writer Countries) England, Wales, and Northern Ireland. The logo at left has been used since 1982. 
