In early editions of the "The Doctrines and Discipline of the Methodist Episcopal Church" (What we would refer to as the Book of Discipline), the opening page gives a brief account of the rise of Methodism, both in Europe and America, using words from John and Charles Wesley:

"In 1729, two young men, in England, reading the Bible, saw they could not be saved without holiness: followed after it, and incited others so to do. In 1727, they saw likewise, that men are justified before they are sanctified: but still, holiness was their object. God then thrust them out to raise a holy people."

From this movement grew one of the largest Protestant denominations in the world, the United Methodist Church. This denomination has been a mainstay of ministry and mission in the world since the 18th century. It has not always been easy and the Church has struggled with the balance between individual local church identity and the connectional global church mission. The last major event for the church was in 1968. Perhaps you remember when the Methodist Episcopal Church and the Evangelical United Brethren Church formed the United Methodist Church.

Unfortunately, the United Methodist Church (UMC) is in a time of struggle and conflict. Perhaps you have read about the potential split in the UMC or the disagreements. I would like to take a minute and share what is happening, what it means to our local church and what the future looks like. Although there are several areas of disagreement in theology and polity, the fundamental struggle the UMC has been wrestling with revolves around LGBTQIA+ issues. The UMC is a connectional denomination and a democratic denomination. This means that all UMC laws must be voted on at the General Conference. (A meeting that happens every 4 years of UMC representatives from all over the world. The voting representatives are 50% clergy and 50% laity.) At each General Conference, the denomination struggled to find common agreement or understanding. This reached a boiling point at a special General Conference in 2019.

Consensus coming out of the 2019 General Conference was that the UMC was no longer viable as a unified denomination and a split was inevitable. Kenneth Feinberg, who oversaw the 9/11 victims' compensation fund volunteered to mediate a grace-filled and amicable split. Their work resulted in the "Protocol of Reconciliation & Grace Through Separation", often simply called 'the Protocol'. This called for the formation of a conservative denomination with a payment from the UMC of \$25 million over 4 years and a path for UMC local churches to transition from the UMC to the conservative denomination as easily as possible. (There would be financial costs, such as paying their portion of the unfunded pension and such, but the church would retain their assets.)

May 2020 would see a vote at the scheduled General Conference, but our world was thrown into a global pandemic and the 2020 General Conference was canceled. The GC was rescheduled twice, but canceled due to pandemic and travel restrictions. The next GC is scheduled for 2024. This brings



us to our current situation. A small conservative wing of the UMC became impatient with the postponements and declared the formation of a new denomination immediately. The Global Methodist Church (GMC) officially came into existence on 5/1/2022. However, without the Protocol approved, churches are subjected to the rules of the Book of Discipline. Few churches have left the UMC. There is no split in the UMC. Instead, there is a very small group breaking away from the UMC. We respect their decision to chart a new course, but I worry of the difficulties of ministerial life that is isolated of the connectional ministry of our denomination. My belief is that over time, a small portion of the UMC will leave, but the overwhelming number of congregations will stay in the connection of the denomination.

What does that mean for the UMC and for our Church? Over the next 5 years, the UMC will begin to look different. It will mean a reduction in the ability to tackle humanitarian and social justice issues. It will create the need to re-evaluate and discern the value and power of being a United Methodist. However, it will hopefully sharpen our identity and focus on serving God by serving the world. The UMC will continue to grapple with sexual identity and sexual orientation issues. However, I predict that the UMC will adopt more confederate attitudes, allowing for Annual Conferences and local churches to have a more direct say of how they would like to proceed. It is crucial that we strive to make room in our denomination to people of all walks of life.

For our church, very little will change. We will continue to focus on being a church dedicated to serving and loving our community. We will continue to love all that come into our building and we will continue to be a family. We may feel the anxiety and stress of the UMC denomination to an extent, but our purpose is to focus on the people of our mission field. We will continue to be here for them. The United Church of Sandwich is a United Methodist Church in name and in spirit. We are called to seek community with each other and love those around us.

I like to joke that I am a United Methodist, because my father was Roman Catholic and my mother was Southern Baptist. The truth is that I am a United Methodist, because the United Methodist Church a block from my house had an after-school kids program. That opened the door to my baptism at 8 years old. The church cared for me as a youth in youth group and affirmed my call into ministry at the age of 18. In my studies I learned of John Wesley and the Wesleyan movement. I found a theological home in the teachings of Methodism. However, long before I understood what it meant to be a Methodist, I felt connected because I was loved by Methodists.

As the UMC faces trials and struggles in the coming months and years, I invite you to remember your baptism and your membership vows to uphold our church with our prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness. In a world and culture that often wants to divide and separate us, the United Methodist church has always been a home that I felt could bring us together. We may not always agree on everything and disagreements happen. However, in the end, we are family and we are one in Christ. If you have any questions and/or concerns about the ongoing UMC struggles, I would be happy to meet with you and help in any way I can.




David Makoba

Staff Pastor Parish Relations Committee will meet Tuesday, June 21st, 6:30pm.




U'Niter's will meet Monday, June 6th, 1:00pm. All women of the church are invited to join the meeting outing.



A HISTORY OF MERGERS \sim My records go back to 1932 when a branch of the, mainly southern, Christian churches merged with the Congregational churches.

In 1946, the Evangelical and United Brethren came together to be followed by a merger with the Methodists in 1968.

The ecumenical movement of the 1920's brought together the Congregational Christian group with the Evangelical and Reformed group to form the United Church of Christ in 1957.

In 1956, I had the honor of attending the last national meeting of the Congregational Christian churches. It was remarkable not only in approving the merger, but that we had an allnight session. A small group of anti-merger people objected to votes taken earlier and so we stayed in session, all night, while all the minutes of that committee were read in their entirety.

It is noteworthy that the E&R group brought a tradition of supporting hospitals while the C-C were supporting colleges. My school, Carleton College, was among them. Today Advocate Aurora Health Care, a UCC related hospital is about to merge with Atrium, for total of 67 hospitals.

This brings us to 1970, right here in Sandwich and the merger of the Congregational and United Methodist congregations to form the United Church of Sandwich. Thanks for reading this bit of history.
