Greetings,

A story from Scotland tells of a mother's dramatic rescue of her child. Workmen were blasting rock in a quarry. One day after they had attached the fuse and retired to a safe place and gave the alarm, they saw a three-year-old child wandering across the open space where danger threatened. Every passing second meant death was closing in on the child. The workmen called to the child and waved their arms, but he only looked at their strange antics with amusement. He did not understand the danger nor the immediacy of harm.

Not one man dared to run forward knowing the explosion was only seconds away. The child most certainly would have been killed, had not his mother appeared at this moment of crisis. The mom seemed to not factor into the situation the amount of time left before the explosion or the risk of her health or life. She simply acted in a way that her heart was called to do so. She did not run toward her son or yell to frighten him. Instead, she knelt down, opened her arms wide and smiled for him to come. Instantly the child ran towards her. Shortly thereafter, the area shook with the force of the explosion, yet no one was hurt that day. The child was safe in his mother's arms.

The world is filled with people who are just like the boy in the story. There are people wandering in life unaware of the danger around them. Or they are living with loneliness, sadness, anxiety, or pain. Our first reaction may be to jump and scream and shout the danger that we see and they do not. We may want to judge them, or look down at their choices. We may try to force them to see the situation the way we see it. This is rarely, if ever successful. Perhaps we can learn from the mother in the story. For the mother the best move was to get on her knees and place herself on her child's level with arms wide open. It was to be a loving, safe place for the child to be.

That is exactly what Jesus Christ did for me. He came to my level with his arms wide open. Instead of hollering at me or yelling at me, Jesus reached out to me. He did the same to you as well. This fall we enter a new school year for the church, I am excited at the opportunities before us in ministry worship and mission. Each week we have an opportunity to reach out and open our arms to the Sandwich community. Let's renew our covenant to be the vessels carrying God's love to those in need. Hearts and minds can be transformed. Lives can be changed. However, it all starts with love.

This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us and his love is made complete in us. 1st John 4:9-12








Adult Bible Study will start on Thursday, October 6th, at 10:00am and last six weeks.

during the fair. The drawing will be held at 6pm on September 11th, at the Log Cabin.




4th Weekend Drive
