Summer ended and autumn began officially at 2:20pm on September 22nd this year. This is known as the Fall Equinox. As a little reminder, the equinox is the time when the Sun travels over the equator and the times of day and night are equal over all of the Northern Hemisphere. The name equinox comes from the Latin for equal and night. In Illinois, we can never be sure what to expect the temperature to be at the beginning of Fall. We could have temperatures in the 90s or in the 40s and anything in between. Regardless of the temperature, the Fall



Equinox signals the change in seasons. It's a marker that God has provided us to remind us of the very notion of change. Wisdom is explained in the Bible as having a listening heart. If we are listening to the Spirit and if we are observant we would notice that God has provided markers in many places to help us remember changes that take place in our lives. Nothing stays the same forever, except for God. God is the one constant in all of reality, and outside of God, change is the only truth. With each change we can look back and remember. We remember the past joys with renewed hope. We remember past mistakes with renewed resolve for growth. We remember what is no longer here with joy and grace. We can also look forward to the newness with hope and anticipation.

I am reminded of Ecclesiastes 3:1-15 which begins "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven; a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted..." Life is often busy and we tend to move forward step-by-step with an attitude of just getting through our responsibilities in this world. We mourn the loss of what you no longer have, and we look with desire of that which we hope to obtain. We often find ourselves living in either the past or the future. However, there is value in focusing on the present. This Passage reminds us that we are called to live in the season we are in, knowing that there will be change. God is in control. In our modern world, we have the ability to control many things. In a way it has given us the illusion that we are in control. However, we cannot stop the changing of the seasons and we cannot stop changes. We cannot turn back the clock or speed up the clock. We can only live in the time that we have. We control only our attitudes during that journey.

What season are you in? How can you lean into your faith with God during this time? For some of us, we must embrace God through the desert experience. We must find comfort in a God who comforts the hurt and oppressed. Some of us are experiencing seasons of joy and success. In those times we sometimes forget the role God plays in our lives. We all tend to forget that no matter what season we are in, it is not permanent but temporary. Change always comes when we are ready and not ready alike. However, God was with us yesterday. He is with us today. He will be with us tomorrow. I hope you have a wonderful autumn this year and no matter what season you are in God has your back! God Bless,





"Commencing with the week of prayer in January, 1869, a series of religious meetings were held in the church in which the pastor was assisted by a number of neighboring clergymen. The meetings continued with hardly an interruption for seven weeks and resulted in many conversions. At the communion services observed on March 7th., thirty-nine persons were admitted to the church on profession of their faith." (Think of that - a 7 week evangelism program!)
