#### Greetings,

These are the lyrics of an old Christian song often sung by children in church. It is lighthearted and simple and profoundly truthful. We are Christians. Our identity rests first with our association with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We are Christians. However, as Christians we have a more specific identity. We are United Methodists as members of the United Church of Sandwich. As Christians, we understand our faith through the lens of the United Methodist Church.

Our Methodist identity does not supersede or displace our Christian identity. Instead it helps us to understand who we are as Christians and who Jesus is as our Lord.

The last several years has been trying for the United Methodist Church. The church is a global community of tens of millions of people. We bring different opinions, traditions, and cultures to the table. The idea that we can be a global Church despite our differences is a sign of God's grace and Power in our lives. Still, our United Methodist differences have brought struggle and dissension in our denomination. Before the Pandemic struck, the global United Methodist Church was scheduled to meet to discuss the best way to move forward. The UMC General Conference has been postponed until 2022. However, there have been some changes in the Northern IL Conference of the United Methodist Church. It is important to understand some of these changes and how they can affect our church. Our actions as a local church have the most impact on the life and health of our church and community. However, we are a connectional denomination, and the changes of the greater church can impact our church in small and large ways. I wish to share a few of these changes with you.

First, Bishop Sally Dyck retired at the end of 2020. The Northern IL Conference (NIC) received retired Bishop John Hopkins as our interim bishop. The Bishop of a conference is akin to the principle of a school. Bishop John Hopkins will serve as our Bishop until the Jurisdictional Conference meets to select a new Bishop. The NIC could receive a new Bishop, or we could be yoked with a neighbor conference. Being yoked would mean that we would continue to be our own conference, but share a bishop, akin to two churches sharing a pastor.

Second, traditionally, the NIC has been divided into 6 districts with each district presiding over about 60 churches and under the leadership of a district superintendent. Traditionally, United Church has been in the Aurora District. The NIC is restructuring on July 1. We are changing from 6 districts to 5 districts with the Aurora District no longer existing. (The **Conference's rationale and districts may be found on pg 2.)** Instead, United Church falls within the boundaries of the Prairie South District. Our New District Superintendent will be Rev. Brian Gilbert. Our new Eastern Boundary is roughly Rt 64. Our District goes west to the IA border, and south to our Southern Conference Boarder (Roughly the IL River/I-80)

These changes do not change our church's structure, mission, and focus. It is important to understand the changes as we continue to be connected with Christians in other churches. However, none of the changes will impact our ability to continue to be the church we know and love. I leave you with this Methodist Prayer for Christian unity.

Let us ask the Lord to strengthen in all Christians faith in Christ, the Savior of the world. Let us ask the Lord to sustain and guide Christians with his gifts along the way to full unity. Let us ask the Lord for the gift of unity and peace for the world. Let us pray.

We ask you, O Lord, for the gifts of your Spirit. Enable us to penetrate the depth of the whole truth, and grant that we may share with others the goods you have put at our disposal. Teach us to overcome divisions. Send us your Spirit to lead to full unity your sons and daughters in full charity, in obedience to your will; through Christ our Lord. Amen.


#### The new five districts are...

The Conference shared the rationale for the change in this announcement...

#### Why reduce the number of districts?

First, there have been many changes in population, demographics, church membership and the number of churches in the NIC. For instance, we've gone from 426 churches 30 years ago (when we last redistricted) to 350 in 2020.



Over the last several years, we have seen how technology enhances the work of a district superintendent (DS) through the use of digital files (when I was a DS we lugged big suitcases of files around!), electronic submission of **forms, and other ways to expedite a DS's work. Out of necessity during the COVID**-19 pandemic, we have utilized communication technologies (mostly Zoom video conferencing) that bring clergy and laity together for many conversations. In-person meetings and gatherings will resume when possible, but we have learned that there are times when we can do our work together via Zoom (and reduce travel time).

We also believe that reducing the number of districts helps position us for an uncertain future. We don't know how COVID-19 will continue to affect us as a conference with the potential for fewer churches. We know that there is a potential loss of churches due to the separation of the UMC that could result in fewer churches in a short period of time.

However, we feel that five instead of four districts helps keep the DSs in touch with churches. The DS has become more of a program consultant than in past years because we have fewer program staff in the conference. Therefore, a manageable number of churches is important. We have also learned from other conferences who have **redistricted that it's possible to reduce too much and lose more in terms of oversight and presence than is gained** financially as a conference.


## **MISSION OF THE MONTH**




