The Unanimous Declaration of the Thirteen United States of America,

WHEN, in the Course of human Events, it becomes necessary for one People to dissolve the Political Bands which have connected them with another, and to assume, among the Powers of the Earth, the separate and equal Station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's GOD entitle them, a decent Respect to the Opinions of Mankind requires that they should declare the Causes which impel them to the Separation.

We hold these Truths to be self-evident, that all Men are created equal, that they are endowed, by their CREATOR, with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness. --That to secure these Rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just Powers from the Consent of the Governed, that whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these Ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its Foundation on such Principles, and organizing its Powers in such Form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness. Prudence, indeed, will dictate, that Governments long established, should not be changed for light and transient Causes; and accordingly all Experience hath shewn, that Mankind are more disposed to suffer, while Evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the Forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long Train of Abuses and Usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object, evinces a Design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their Right, it is their Duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future Security. Such has been the patient Sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the Necessity which constrains them to alter their former Systems of Government. The History of the present King of Great-Britain is a History of repeated Injuries and Usurpations, all having in direct Object the Establishment of an absolute Tyranny over these States. To prove this, let Facts be submitted to a candid World.

Greetings,

In this message the founders of our country declared that they were no longer under the rule of a king an ocean away. They were free to create and order their civic affairs as they knew best. The United States and modern democracy were born on July 4, 1776. Their words did not match their actions completely. Minorities and women were not equal. Slavery was an active reality. Fairness as we understand the word did not exist. It would take a long time for the country to live up to the ideals written above. **We are still on that journey as we often have taken two steps forward, and one step back through our nation's history.** However, the journey began simply with a declaration of freedom. On July 4th Americans all over the country will remember and celebrate that we have freedom.

As Christians, many of us have experienced our own independence days. We were under the tyranny of our own self-destructive choices and sin. However, we gained freedom not by using our own power to break free from the control of sin, but **accepting the freedom Christ gives through his sacrifice.** Galatians 5:1 says "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery."

I want you to celebrate the freedom of our nation, but I also want you to celebrate the freedom you have in Christ. Max Lucado tells the story of a boy who was shooting rocks with a slingshot. Never hitting his target. One day when he was in his Grandma's backyard he spied her pet duck. On impulse he took aim and let fly. The stone hit, and the duck was dead. The boy panicked and hid the bird in the woodpile, looking up he saw his sister watching. After lunch that day, Grandma told Sally to help with the dishes. Sally said, "Johnny told me he wanted to help in the kitchen today. Didn't you Johnny?" And she whispered to him, "Remember the duck!" So, Johnny did the dishes. What choice did he have? For the next several weeks he was at the sink often. **Sometimes for his duty, sometimes for his sin. "Remember the duck," Sally'd whisper when he objected. After a while tho' he** grew so weary of the chore, he decided that any punishment would be better than washing more dishes, so he confessed to killing the duck. "I know, Johnny," his Grandma said, giving him a hug. "I was standing at the window and saw the whole thing. Because I love you, I forgave you. I wondered how long you would let Sally make a servant out of you." He thought that his confession would doom him. However, his grandmother was the one able to free him from his guilt and shame.

God's love is BIG. It is readily available. It will set you free. This month we will celebrate our earthly freedom. Let's make it a month that we also celebrate our spiritual freedom. It is not just freedom from another nation or a tyrant. It is a freedom from our own sin and death. It is a freedom in Christ. That is a cause to celebrate! God Bless, Pastor Tom Bourke

Historical Thoughts from Pastor Bob Dell



If you read the first installment of this series on the history of the Sandwich Congregational Church you may well have been left wondering about the church first being located in Little Rock. A history of the church comments as follows: “Little Rock at the time was an active and forward-looking community. Situated as it was on the old Galena Road from Aurora, with excellent hotel accommodations for the traveling public. It was for many years the center of progress in this section of the state. The building of the Burlington railway to the south of Little Rock cut short its burgeoning career and in time it reverted to the calm peace of a farming community.”

“On the 10th day of May, 1856, the members unanimously voted ‘the location of the church be changed to Sandwich...and its name be changed to the Congregational Church of Sandwich. Two weeks later, on the 24th of May 1856, the first meeting of the church in Sandwich was held at the residence of Deacon John Hubbard.”

It will surprise many of us that there might be “Sunday School way back then, but the 1953 history states: “In 1857, Dr. W.W. Sedgwick and Deacon John Hubbard organized the Sunday School and Deacon Hubbard was probably the first superintendent” “Those were the days of crude and primitive Sunday school methods. The great work of the International Sunday School Commission had not begun” Rose Coleman later wrote: “Miss Pauline Newton taught in leadership training conferences at Tower Hill and was generous in her service with the children in her home church” At the Sandwich library you can see a picture of Miss Pauline and her faithful dog. She was library director for many years. Some will remember Lorene Stinson who spent many years at the then Sandwich State Bank. She was “following in the footsteps of her grandmother and mother.”





What you need:

- Bean bags
- Tables, chairs, pillows
- Painter's tape

What you do:

Players line up behind the Leader, who moves around in various ways. Followers must copy the Leader's movements faithfully. Try these variations:

1. Players must balance a bean bag on their head as they follow the Leader.
2. Set up an obstacle course, and follow the Leader by crawling under tables and chairs, hopping over pillows and so on.


