On November 21, 1943, Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote a letter to his fiancé, Maria von Wedemeyer, while he was imprisoned by Hitler during World War II. In the letter, he talked about a spiritual lesson he was learning from his life as a prisoner. He wrote: "A prison cell, in which one waits, hopes, does various unessential things, and is completely dependent on the fact that the door of freedom has to be opened from the outside is not a bad picture of Advent."

Hope is one of the most priceless things a person can have in their life. Chuck Swindoll wrote, 'We can live several weeks without food, days without water, and only minutes without oxygen, but without hope - forget it.' When we face, pain, hardship or illness, we need the hope of God in our life. We need the hope of the love of Christ with us. Even when it seems that the world has turned upside

down, the hope of knowing God is with us and in control is the very thing that keeps us right side up. How do we remember this when we are going through a trial? Easter is here and hope will shine bright as we wake up to an empty tomb. However, experiencing the empty tomb requires us to see the hope today, while in the journey to the cross.


First, remember who you are. You are a child of God. You have been made by the creator, and sanctified by the redeemer. This means you are an heir to the kingdom of God. You came from God and you will return to God. This is who you are!

Remember the words of Jeremiah 1:5. 'Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, before you were born I set you apart'. 1 Peter 2:9 says, "But you are a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God, that you may declare the praises of him who called you out of darkness into his wonderful light" This is who you are. I have hope, because of who God has made me to be as His servant.

We have hope because of whose we are. More importantly than who we are is whose we are. We are God's. God is the foundation of our existence. God is the foundation of our hope. We have confidence because our confidence is in the Lord. We have strength because God is the source of our strength. God always overcomes and we participate in the victory. We know that the final victory belongs to God. He wins! My hope is in His victory. It is through God's love that I share in this victory. As Vice President of the U.S., George Bush represented the U.S. at the funeral of former Soviet leader Leonid Brezhnev. Bush was deeply moved by a silent protest carried out by Brezhnev's widow. She stood motionless by the coffin until seconds before it was closed. Then, just as the soldiers touched the lid, Brezhnev's wife performed an act of great courage and hope, a gesture that must surely rank as one of the most profound acts of civil disobedience ever committed: She reached down and made the sign of the cross on her husband's chest. There in the citadel of secular, atheistic power, the wife of the man who had run it all hoped that her husband was wrong. She hoped that there was another life, and that that life was best represented by Jesus who died on the cross, and that the same Jesus might yet have mercy on her husband.

As we continue through the trial of the COVID19 pandemic, and the trials caused due to this pandemic, HOPE is the most valuable resource that you can hold in your life. It cannot be bought, but is freely given. You cannot put a price tag on HOPE, but it is priceless to those who possess it. HOPE is a gift from God for you in this moment and there is no better time to discover HOPE than in the Easter story. Easter gives me HOPE. The funeral of Good Friday turned into the celebration of Easter. Tragedy turned into triumph. Fear turned into HOPE. That HOPE is mine and that HOPE belongs to God. My prayer is that you find your HOPE in God this Easter!

GO THROUGH YOUR NORMAL SUNDAY ROUTINE minus the "hurry up, we're late" part


> GATHER TOGETHER AS A FAMILY no multitasking; worship is a family activity

The office will be maintaining normal office hours for the time being, and the sanctuary will be open during office hours for personal prayer and reflection.


Please call the church office with any updated email addresses or if you know of anyone that would benefit from this information.

A Note From the Treasurer

Financial Outlook 2020

On Sunday, March 8th the Finance Committee made a presentation to the congregation regarding the financial outlook for 2020. The overall theme presented is that our income although steady is not keeping up with the rising expenses of our church. The following chart shows the trend for both income and expense for the last 5 years. 2020 income has been budgeted on the conservative side based on pledges given.



The budget for 2020 is as follows:

Tithe & Offerings	\$131,600
Other Income	<u>\$ 9,640</u>
Total Income	<u>\$141,240</u>
Apportionment Payable	12,500
Other Expenses	<u>170,001</u>
Total Expenses	\$ <u>182,501</u>
Deficit	(41,261)
Remaining 2019 Fair Profits	<u>11,746</u>
Budget Shortfall yet to meet	\$ <u>(29,515)</u>

The finance committee is working on ideas to meet this shortfall and ways to provide long-term income. However, we are open to any and all ideas from the congregation. We also need volunteer power when considering these ideas and options for us. We are a strong and united church! Please work with the finance committee to help resolve our ongoing budget issues.
