Greetings,

To fast or not to fast? That is the question. Ash Wednesday was on February 26. This marks the beginning of a 40-day journey through lent to Easter Sunday. Traditionally, Christians have used the Lenten season to fast. This follows in the footsteps of Jesus who went without food for 40 days while in the desert. The question I ask you, should you fast this Lent? That is a deeply personal question that should be decided between you and the Lord. However, I have some thoughts that may help you focus your decision for Lent.



First, let's begin with the purpose of Lent. Lent is a time of examination, repentance, and renewal. Easter Sunday is a resurrection experience for us spiritually. The impact of Easter Sunday can be affected by how we journey through Lent. Lent can be an interesting time. I found this quote. 'the season of Lent is like a roller coaster ride with emotions that are down and up again and again as the story of our salvation makes plain our sinful ways and the cost of redemption.' From, A Guide to Prayer for All who Seek God. So, Lent is a critical time for us. For this reason, engaging in the spiritual practice of fasting is a wonderful response to the importance of traveling towards Easter Sunday.

How do I fast? One misconception of fasting is that we must take what we love the most and give it up during Lent. Fasting is not meant to be punishment we inject on ourselves. It is not meant to be a painful experience. 'Lent is not a six-week inconvenience in an otherwise abundant year, during which we have to somehow please God with voluntary if minor suffering.' Marjorie Thompson. Fasting is a time of spiritual house cleaning. We give up something in our lives so that we may divert our attention to God. What we decide to fast can be as varied as the people in our congregation. It can be different for everybody. Fasting is not easy, but the struggle helps us to find our strength in the Lord.

If you decide to give something up for Lent, I encourage you to only do so if you can also use your energy towards engaging with the Lord more. For example, if you were to give up Facebook, use the time you would normally be on Facebook to pray or read the scriptures. If you gave up chocolate, use the money that you would have normally spent on chocolate to buy a devotional and read some of it each day throughout Lent. Fasting is an opportunity to be renewed by the spirit because we are seeking to become less of us, and more of God.

Finally, I want you to remember the math of Lent. I know it sounds weird to discuss math when focusing on Lent but it is just as important as the fasting. Lent is 40 days. However if you were to do the math on the calendar, you would notice that there are more than 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter. The numbers don't add up. Why? That is because each Sunday during Lent is not actually a part of Lent. Sundays are meant to be a mini Easter. Sundays are a time to reflect and focus on the resurrection of the Lord and of our spirit. If you wish to give up something for the entire time of Lent, you may do so, but Sundays during Lent are meant to be a break from the focus of repentance and a chance to experience some resurrection joy! I encourage you to spend the next week in prayer. Consider what you may be willing to give up this Lent. Let that sacrifice not be the focus of your lent, but the Catalyst towards re-engaging in your relationship with God. Enjoy your Sundays with joy in your heart for he is risen! Most of all, use this Lent to prepare for the resurrection of Christ. He died for us, and he rose for us!






