## Christ is Risen!


"Are we there yet?" Along with many of you, I remember speaking those words from the backseat of my family's car during any number of trips. I also remember those words more recently coming from the backseat as a parent driving my children on trips. I will admit, it got tough when a long trip got longer when we would encounter a sign that read 'DETOUR'. The kids would groan and my spirit would sink. The sign 'DETOUR' meant that our arrival was going to be delayed. It meant the kids would be saying 'Are we there yet' more and I would be on the road past the time I expected.

We have all encountered a massive DETOUR in our lives this spring. We entered this journey thinking it might be a small disruption or a slight bump in the road, but discovered that the Covid19 virus has become a major detour for everyone. A couple of months ago we did not have phrases like 'social distancing', 'homemade facemasks', and 'why in the world is Walmart out of toilet paper?!' in our lexicon. Now they are commonplace. We are asking how many more days will this crisis last? How many more weeks will we be engaging in worship online instead of in person? How many more events will be cancelled?

The detour does not mean we have been separated from God and does not mean that God is not still at work in our lives today. Paul wrote in Romans 8:28 that "in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." I love this realization. God is working with us to create good in whatever situation the world is in. God is taking the detour and recreating it into a new journey. It is not the path we expected, but God is creating as we speak. Our family life and routines have been turned upside down. This 'detour' has created for family time, new opportunities, to grow through activities and togetherness. It has been a challenge and a gift. My kids have shown leadership and strength in helping me to lead worship on Sunday as my worship team. The challenges of the pandemic has renewed my dependence of my faith and reminded me not to put God in a box. I am seeing a collective desire to reconnect in the faith from people everywhere.

None of us plan for detours in our lives. However, God can use detours to teach us in ways we cannot learn anywhere else. He can use the most uncomfortable detour to remind us that He is the source of our peace – not our circumstances. And he can use even the hardest and most challenging detour to reveal to us that the most important thing is not the destination, but enjoying God on the journey and seeing what he is able to show us in the process. We are separated in person, but united in the spirit. My prayers are continually with you and God Bless!

## Meetings & Activities Suspended In Person









## CHANGED!

Make this cute puppet to show and tell the amazing story of metamorphosis.




### What you need:

- Needle and string
- 12 small pom-poms
- Wooden craft stick
- Scissors
- Googly eyes
- Glue
- Coffee filter
- Markers

### What you do:


1. Sew pom-poms together to make a caterpillar body. Tie off that string.
2. Thread another string up through the first pom-pom, leaving 12 inches to dangle. Repeat with the ninth pom-pom, leaving two dangling strings.
3. Wrap those strings around opposite ends of the stick, adjusting their length to about 6 inches. Tie in place.
4. Glue on eyes.
5. Flatten the coffee filter and draw a symmetrical design on it. Pleat in the center to create wings.
6. Move the caterpillar puppet by holding the stick. Glue on the wings as you describe the transformation into a butterfly.

**Memorial Day** commemorates the men and women who **died** while in the military service of their country. Traditionally, people visit cemeteries and memorials, and volunteers often place American flags on each grave site at national cemeteries. A national moment of remembrance takes place at 3:00 p.m. local time. In 1971, Memorial Day became a national holiday by an act of Congress; it is now celebrated annually on the last Monday in May.

In the war-torn battlefields of Europe, the common red field poppy was one of the first plants to reappear. Its seeds scattered in the wind and sat dormant in the ground, only germinating when the ground was disturbed—as it was by the very brutal fighting of World War 1. John McCrae, a Canadian soldier and physician, witnessed the war first hand and was inspired to write the now-famous poem “In Flanders Fields” in 1915. He saw the poppies scattered throughout the battlefield surrounding his artillery position in Belgium.

## “In Flanders Fields”

by John McCrae, May 1915

*In Flanders fields the poppies blow  
Between the crosses, row on row,  
That mark our place; and in the sky  
The larks, still bravely singing, fly  
Scarce heard amid the guns below.*

*We are the Dead. Short days ago  
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glow,  
Loved and were loved, and now we lie  
In Flanders fields.*

*Take up our quarrel with the foe:  
To you from failing hands we throw  
The torch; be yours to hold it high.  
If ye break faith with us who die  
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow  
In Flanders fields.*
